

Prosthesis Project Nov. 28 – Dec. 3



Nov. 28 – Dec 3. Gifts from The Thai Christian Foundation (TCF) through the Thai operating arm, Pan Rak (Sharing Love) Foundation (PRF) helped the Queen Mother's Prosthesis Foundation give prostheses to 151 persons.







PRF arranged for 67 Karen, Karenni, and Shan landmine victims to come across the border in Myanmar to Umphang City, Tak Province, Thailand. We had to pray them past all the police check points. We housed and fed them at the Border Police Station because one of our Umphang Church leaders serves there. PRF also helped the other patients by making donations to the Prosthesis Foundation and to Umphang Hospital.









(1) When this man received two new legs, he said he could not sleep all night. He had not walked in 7 years, only crawled. (2) Achan Eed, who helps Pan Rak in Pa-Oh and Shan evangelism in Chiang Mai, gives our bags containing blankets, toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap and multipurpose towels to the patients. We held evangelism services at night, but only a few could attend because fittings were made at night. On the last night we were able to get the whole group together including many local young people. Allan's message in Thai was translated into Karen, Burmese and Shan. We had not tried this before and there was a lot of laughter when Allan kept forgetting and starting another sentence before the last Shan translator finished. Still about 40 stood up to receive Christ. We took names to send back to Burma for follow-up. Some were local youth who already believed.

The Head of the Prosthesis Foundation and the Head of Umphang Hospital (kneeling) present the first prosthesis Dec. 3rd. That day, H.R.H. Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn came to open the Prosthesis Center, and Allan and Joan made a gift to her charity on behalf of PRF.
